

Housing that a household can pay for, while still having money left over for other necessities like food, transportation, and health care.





- The best estimate of the number of people experiencing unsheltered homelessness in Pima County in January of 2021 is 854 individuals.

- EELS Program provides free legal counsel.
- Includes Navigators to explain process and connect tenants with County and Community resources
- •EELS has had over 1000 contacts resulting in more than 400 legal referrals since it began in August.

- The County and City opened a new "prevention hub" to address the emergency housing needs of vulnerable individuals and families, many who are facing homelessness for the first time.
